LIST OF DISEASES CONTRAINDICATED FOR TRAINING IN A SPECIALTY "MEDICINE"

Candidates with the following diseases are not admitted:

1. Severe neurological diseases that lead to significant impairment of motor functions: disseminated sclerosis, parkinsonism, athetosis, *etc.*, extrapyramidal hyperkinesis, traumatic encephalopathy, traumatic damage to the spinal cord and peripheral nerves, permanent residual damage to the central and peripheral nervous systems after inflammatory toxic and vascular diseases, syringomyelia, systemic progressive diseases of the nervous system and muscular apparatus.

2. Mental illnesses: schizophrenia - initial state /schizophrenic defect/, permanent schizophrenic personality change ongoing schizophrenia: cyclophrenia – alternating and chronic course, frequent psychotic phases, epilepsy – pronounced epileptic personality change, frequent / especially grandiose/epileptic seizures, proven true paranoia, traumatic and other encephalopathies with severe character and intellectual - amnestic changes.

3. Open forms of tuberculosis.

4. Severe diseases of the cardiovascular system.

5. Severe and untreatable polyallergic diseases - for all specialties: medication allergy, manifested in the last years before the application - for the specialties of dentistry and pharmacy.

6. Primary varicose veins of the superficial venous system of the lower limbs; postphlebitic syndrome in its three forms / oedematous, secondary varicose veins, trophic changes/, lymphostasis /elephant disease/ of the lower limbs - for the specialties of dentistry and pharmacy.

7. Uncompensated permanent damage to the musculoskeletal system. Contraindicated orthopaedic injuries and illnesses are considered:

a) uncompensated damage to the upper limb significantly impairing its functions;

b) amputated upper limb, absence of three or more fingers, of which I, II and III fingers are mandatory;

c) congenital anomalies of an upper extremity resulting in severe disability;

d) condition after flaccid paralysis of an upper limb, significantly impairing its function;

e) uncompensated damage to the lower limb, significantly impairing its function / for the specialty dentistry/;

f) high amputated limb at the base of the thigh / for the specialty dentistry/;

g) congenital and acquired deformities of the spine and chest /for the specialty of dentistry/;

h) congenital dysplasia or dislocation of the hip joint / for the specialty dentistry/;

i) severe congenital and static deformities of the feet /for the specialty dentistry/.

8. Absolute and practical bilateral blindness and progressive diabetic retinopathy.

9. Disorder of colour perception - anopia, anomaly type A, B and C.

10. Progressive and high myopia and diabetic retinopathy, leading to a decrease in vision to 0.8 of the better seeing eye with tolerable correction and vision from both eyes at least 1.4. violation of binocular vision, myopia over 8.00 d. and hypermetropia over 6.00 d. /for dentistry and pharmacy/.

11. Juvenile and pigmentary degenerations of the retina.

12. Permanent incurable hearing loss in both ears.

13. Severe speech disorders and major dysphonia.

14. Chronic ulcero-hemorrhagic colitis with frequent exacerbations and complications, as well as other chronic and postoperative 8 diseases of the alimentary system, liver and biliary tract that limit the patient's ability to work.

15. Chronic recurrent pancreatitis.

16. Paraplegia, hemiplegia, permanent, partial or total aphasia, severe and permanent dyskinesias.

17. Pemphigus vulgaris, progressive scleroderma, dermatomyositis, psoriatic arthritis / severe, unresponsive forms/, polyarteritis nodosa, mycosis fungoides, Kaposi's disease, disease Recklinghausen, epidermolysis hereditaria, ichthyosis vulgaris – severe forms, erythema subacute and chronic, xeroderma pigmentosum.
